Your personal data and our website

- We do not re-use the information for another purpose that is different to the one stated;
- We put in place measures to guarantee that your data are kept up-to-date and processed securely;
- Under certain conditions outlined in law, we may disclose your information to third parties, (such as the European Anti-Fraud Office, the Court of Auditors, or law enforcement authorities) if it is necessary and proportionate for lawful, specific purposes;
- We will never divulge your personal data for direct marketing purposes;

How to exercise your data protection rights at the EEA

- If the EEA is processing your personal data and you would like to exercise your data protection rights, please send us a written request by clicking on "Contact" in the footer .
- You can send also your request to the EEA by post in a sealed envelope or use [our application form](#).
- Your request should contain a detailed description of the data you wish to have access to.
- You must provide a copy of an identification document to confirm your identity, for example a passport, an ID card or a driving licence. The document shall contain an identification number, country of issue, period of validity and your full name.
- Any other data contained in the copy of the identification document (e.g. photo, personal characteristics, date and place of birth, address) will not be processed and may thus be blacked out.
- Our use of the information contained in the copy of your identification document is strictly limited: the data will only be used to verify your identity.
- The document will be stored for a maximum period of three months from the date of receipt of your request.

Cookie policy/Site usage information

What are cookies?

Cookies are short text files stored on a user's device (such as a computer, tablet or phone) by a website.

Cookies are used for the technical functioning of a website or for gathering statistics.

Cookies are also typically used to provide a more personalised experience for a user for example, when an online service remembers your user profile without you having to login.

When you visit our website, we may collect some data on your browsing experience such as your IP address, the EEA page you visited, when you visited and the website page you were redirected from.

This information is used to gather aggregated and anonymous statistics with a view to improving our services and to enhance your user experience.

How do we use cookies?

We use session and persistent cookies to reflect the user's choice to the cookie consent.

A session cookie (also known as an in-memory cookie or transient cookie) exists only in the temporary memory of the browser while the user navigates the website. Web browsers normally delete session cookies when the user closes the browser. Session cookies are temporarily saved in the user's browser and their only purpose is to reflect the choice of the user of not allowing persistent cookies.

In case you allow it, the website also uses persistent cookies to save the user's preference, and retrieve it during the next visits. An application cookie, containing the user's positive answer to the use of cookies, will be stored in the user's browser for a period of 11 months. After this period expires, the user will be prompted to give his/her consent again.

To receive statistics, EEA is relying on Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by Google, Inc. ('Google'). Google Analytics uses cookies, to help the EEA web team analyse how users use the site. The information generated by the cookie about your use of the website will be transmitted to and stored by Google on its servers. To protect your privacy, Analytics removes the last part of your IP address prior to its use and storage. Google will use information from the cookies for the purpose of evaluating your use of the website, compiling reports on website activity for website operators and providing other services relating to website activity and internet usage.
